If you never finished high school, the GED® test will serve as proof that you have acquired the equivalent of a high school education on your own.

Prepare for the GED Math Test

Master the skills required to successfully pass Test 5 in the GED® test series. You'll start off with a review of math basics and begin building the foundation you'll need to solve the types of math problems commonly found on the test. In the process, you'll develop hands-on experience with fractions, decimals, percents, proportions, statistics, algebra, and geometry.

Then, you'll get a chance to apply your knowledge by practicing with the same kind of questions you may encounter on the GED® test. By the time you finish this course, you'll be much more comfortable with your math skills, and you'll know how, when, and why to use each math concept you learn.

Prepare for the GED Language Arts, Writing Test

This course will help you prepare to take both parts of this two-part exam.
